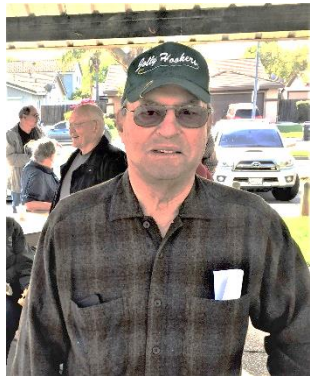

FISHING CHAIRMAN'S REPORT

Greeting's everyone. I made it out fishing finally, but only once last month. I got a perfect weather day in the Delta. No wind, not even a breeze. I was able to fish both low and high tides in same morning. I launched at Sherman Island and headed to my usual place by Broad Slough. I was able to fish the low tide and the bite was on. The Stripers were hitting and I landed 10 fish from 17 to 25" in about an hour then the bite was off.

There is nothing more exciting when a striper hits and the clicker starts screaming. I later moved to other parts of the San Joaquin River before heading to the West Bank. The fish were not at the West Bank and I was the only boat in the area. I decided pull up and move elsewhere when I notice my water pump was not working on my main motor. I decided not use it but rather use the kicker and troll back to the launch. I hit the high tide when I reached the lower entrance of Decker Island and fished it to the entrance of Sherman Island Lake. The bite was back on again where I got into a school of larger fish all over 20".

Worried about what problems I might have with the water pump (impeller) not working when I got home I started calling all the shops in the area. I called about 10 shops and with the same results, the earliest they

could get me in would be late November to mid-December. The very last shop I called was **“Marine Service Center”** just down the street from the Elks Lodge where we met. About 10 year ago it was a boat dismantler and they went away with dismantling boats, got rid of all the junk and turned it into boat service center. Not knowing this I called them out of curiosity. To my surprise not only can they do the work they said bring it in, in a few days. I arrived at 8:00 AM to drop off my boat and was impressed with size of their yard and facility. At 3:00 the same day they called and said the boat was ready for pick-up. They replace both impellers on both motors. It was 6 years ago when it was last done. The manger is **Andy** and I was able to talk to him for a while. They have 4 service technicians plus the office staff. I recommend giving them a call if you need to have some service done on your boat. **Marine Service Center 916-638-7935**
