OPEN LETTER TO CLUB MEMBERS

The Jolly Hookers Fishing Club

Hey guys, I hope that you and your families are all doing well. That being said, in reality, we all know that that is *not* going to be the case. It is one of the reasons I thought that I needed to try to say something to all of you.

What makes a "club"? Google defines a social club this way: "Generally, social clubs are membership organizations primarily supported by dues, fees, charges or other funds paid by their members. The central purpose of social clubs is to provide benefits to members, including access to social and recreational facilities...."

In our case, what comes to mind is our common interest in the activity of *fishing*. Are we providing those "benefits"? Many members of our steering committee are questioning the future viability of our club. Some of us are choosing to remain as part of the committee for more than one term. That is not necessarily a bad thing, but I think it would help if we had more participation. In general, our club membership is getting older and smaller in numbers.

Do you remember the Striped Bass Association? Well, the Sacramento chapter is a thing of the past along with the Wheels and Reels, our sister club.

Ralph Schuhriemen used to help us organize trips to Shasta and Whiskeytown for trout and kokanee. Attached is an example, "Shasta Lake 2018". THANK YOU RALPH! Later in the year, he would do the same for ocean salmon and rock cod. Ralph is now 95 years old. He recently told me that last year was a very difficult year for him. We cannot expect him to continue to assist us the way he has in the past. Who is going to "take over" for him? Franklin Call used to set up some trips out of Berkley, fishing in the bay for halibut and striper. His health also suffered greatly last year.

There were groups of us that used to take trips to places like Lake Almanor and Pyramid Lake in Nevada. Now it all seems like that was a thing of the past. What happened to us, old age, Covid, or the lack of water? I don't know, but I am hoping that we can reverse this trend. To change anything, *I will need your help!* I am willing to offer advice and to help in any way I can, but I want to get your input on how to proceed. If any of *you* are interested, please let me know soon. It looks like we are going to have enough water this year to go about anywhere we want.

Before I wrap this up, I want to give you a couple of examples of some of the things we can do to get things going. Suggest a trip to a certain lake during a specific date

or dates. Let's say Pyramid Lake in May. What are the requirements for fishing this lake? In this case, the lake is controlled by the Piute Indian Tribe, and a fishing permit is required. A three-day permit costs \$62, and can be purchased on line through a web site "Pyramid Lake us/permits or the Ranger Station in Sutcliff, NV.

Whoever signs up to go can fish from a private boat, hire and go with an approved guide, or fish from shore. You don't have to fly fish from shore, and it can be very productive. Steve Paulick and I did it a few years ago and we caught some nice fish.

Suggest a place to stay like the Nugget in Sparks or Crosby's Lodge. Back in 2017, a group of six (6) of us stayed at Crosby's Lodge Sutcliff Inn #7. It has a kitchen, 2 bathrooms, and a shower for \$260/night. It is currently available for the entire month of May. There is also a house available, through Crosby Lodge, that will accommodate 8 for \$406 per night. The Nugget in Sparks has rooms available with 2 queen beds for \$115 per night.

What about food? We can either bring our own and cook or eat out. If we bring our own food let's say for breakfast and lunch, who is going to be responsible to decide what to bring? Should we cook our own dinner or eat out? Do we caravan on the way up and stop for lunch? Where do we stop?

As you can see there is a lot of planning and research involved, but the trips can be a lot of fun. So, who wants to go to Pyramid Lake in May? Please let me know very soon. The sooner the better.

Who is going to be in charge of a trip to Shasta or Lake Almanor? How about Whiskeytown? Any other suggestions, like fall trips for Salmon or rock cod?

I received the follow response from Mr. Darold Perry at SMUD in regards to an email I sent SMUD.

"As to your question regarding fish stocking at Ice House in 2022, yes it was performed. However, SMUD reduced the normal allotment in 2022 due to the fact that the Ice House boat ramp (and thus motorboat access) was closed for the year while SMUD rebuilt the Ice House Campground area including the boat ramp facility (another requirement of the License). This is probably another topic your organization would be interested in, as SMUD is improving the amenities at all of our reservoirs. Nevertheless, a lesser poundage was stocked at Ice House in 2022 to satisfy bank fishermen, with the balance being redistributed to Union Valley and Loon Lake Reservoirs. We will resume full allotments at each of the three reservoirs in 2023."
