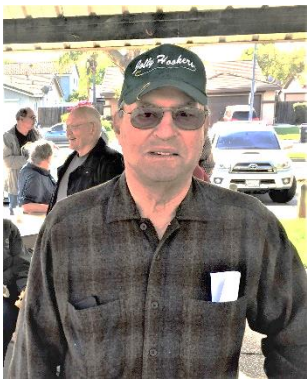

FISHING CHAIRMAN'S REPORT

Greeting everyone once again and I hope you are all doing okay. We have had some very nice weather the last 2 months not typical for Jan. and Feb. I hope some of you got out and were able to do some fishing. After 3 months of collecting dust and cobwebs I finally got my boat out and did some fishing. I decided to go to Pardee on its opener Feb 18. On the way there I heard Bob Sims fishing report on the radio. I should have turned around right then and headed to Berryessa instead. He said the trout and salmon fishing was picking up and doing much better. I arrived at Pardee well before sunrise expecting to be first at the boat ramp and found myself in the third group of 4 boats to launch. The parking area was also full of vehicles and float tubers, kayaks and shore fisherman. On the way out from the launch one person remarked over the

radio "It looks like a swarm of ants "as the shore fisherman took their place along the water's edge.



It was not the day I expected. First off one of my transducers broke off and was banging and hitting the stern of the boat when I speeded up after the no wake zone. I glad I installed a second fish finder backup system just for this type of occasion. Fishing was very poor if you had a boat. Could not find the fish and most boats were just lucky to catch a fish. It was so bad the game wardens weren't checking any boaters on the way out. On the other hand if you were a shore fisherman it was easy limits. They planted the day before and once again that morning. The 3 game wardens were checking all vehicles (except boaters) on the way out for over limits.

I managed to catch 1 nice 3lb rainbow. But early in the morning I caught a very large fish that fought like hell. I thought I had on a large Brown and the fish stayed deep and under the boat. When it did get close to the surface it was wide and dark and looked like a big Brown. When I landed it, it was a 6 1/2 lb. 28" long and a fish I had never seen before. I asked other boaters on the lake what it was, and they too had no idea what type of fish it was. When I arrived back at the launch, I asked the boat inspectors, and they had no clue either. They had plenty of names; but not sure what to call it. They called for one of the Game Wardens to look at it and he was not sure also. It is a cross between 2 other fish species, and it was still alive after being in ice chest for over 4 hr. They told me not to put it back in the lake. I caught it on a speedy shiner off the bottom. I cut it open to see what it was eating, and its stomach was empty; but it was full of eggs. It's a predator fish without any teeth. Its scales look big and rough but are remarkably smooth

much like trout. When I was leaving one of the other Game Wardens gave me a name for it.
