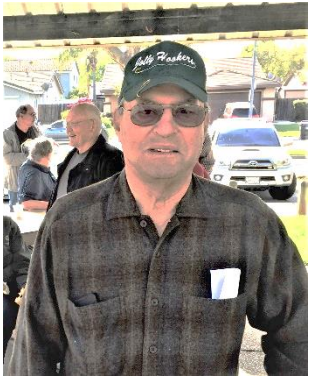

Hello everyone. Some of us were able to get out and have our first Jolly Hooker outing in a long time at Collins Lake. There were only 5 boats on the lake on a very nice warm day at Collins Lake. Unfortunately, the fish weren't to cooperative. Most all of us were able to put a few fish in the boat. Cal Kellogg was right about marking lots of fish at the 30 to 40 feet and those fish were in no mood to bite. Most of the fish were caught at the surface. Water temperature started out at 55 and by 2:00 it was around 60 degrees. It was the first hot day of year and a full moon and that might have been the reason for the shut down on the bite.

At our next meeting we need to decide how we want to run our NDO's and Derbies and pick our locations for the remainder of the year? This is a list of things we need to think about and have discussion on.
