### HEAD HOOKER'S MESSAGE

Hello guys, Well, here we are at the beginning of April with a good outlook on water levels for our lakes and reservoirs. After three years of drought, it looks like we're going to be able to fill our fishing

grounds with plenty of water. Presently, almost all of our reservoirs are at or beyond their historical averages. Some reservoirs are having to let out a significant amount of water to maintain space for the upcoming above-average snowmelt. According to the National Weather Service more snow is expected for this April. The snowpack provides 30% of California's freshwater and plays a critical role in replenishment of reservoir levels according to the UC Berkeley Central Sierra Snow Laboratory.

Don't forget to sign the Boater and Non-Boater sheets at the door at the next meeting. If you are a boater and would like to take someone out the next time you go out, it would be a great way to meet and get acquainted with someone new. If you're a Non-Boater and you sign up, those with a boat would be able to look at the list and select someone to take with them. Unfortunately, we are unable to make copies of the sign-up sheet at the Elks club. Give me a call at 916 635-3020 and I will send you a copy of the Non-Boater sheet by email. I will have copies from our prior meeting of Non-Boater sign up's available at the door. We're all about fishing, so let's get everyone out there on the water that we can.

Also, if you've taken a fishing trip lately, take some pictures and let us know about your trip. As a side-note, don't forget the Coast Guard Auxiliary will be at the West Marine Store for boat inspections every second Friday of the month starting in April. The inspection is free. It will continue throughout the summer. They will be there from 9 AM to 1 PM. West Marine is located at 9500 Micron Avenue, over by Capital Christian Church along Hw50 in Sacramento. Because this is a volunteer service by the Auxiliary, you can call ahead to West Marine at 916-366-3300 to check on any changes in scheduling. If you're in need of equipment dealing with your boat inspection, West Marine is there to provide boating accessories, parts, related apparel and fishing supplies. ## FISHING CHAIRMAN'S REPORT

We wanted rain and we got it. I'm glad we didn't schedule anything for March. Our normal 2 Tuesdays that we fish were blown out with rain and wind and also the following Tuesday. Looking ahead to April, I'm

hoping the weather will change to spring like conditions so we can get out and do some fishing. My best reports right now is still Camanche and Lake Amador. Both are still doing weekly big fish plants with some supper big fish in the mix.

Fish are being caught at both lakes and when the water clears some, it will only get better. I'm not ruling out other lakes. I just haven't heard any reports on them.

Also, the Striper Fishing in the Delta should be starting soon after water flows get back to somewhat normal. That might take another month and I hope it flushes out all the grass and water hyacinth in the system.

I haven't fished since our last outing in February and can't wait to get back on the water. Any suggestions as where to go fishing will be helpful.

I will be heading back to Bridgeport for the Eastern Sierra Trout Opener at the end of April. I missed last year for one of the very few time in the past 45 years. My group went back and had a good time. I went and fished the Kokanee Power Derby at Shasta Lake instead where I took first place. I called Bridgeport and they are still digging out from all the snow this year and more is on its way.

With all the snow and rain this year all the lakes are above their historical averages. Shasta Lake went over its historical average last week and is now at 81% of capacity. Big jump up from last year's peak of only 35% of capacity. The only lake legging behind is New Melones at 92% of historical average and 57 % of total capacity and rising fast. With the snow pack at 257% in the Sierra's I bet it will be at its capacity by this summer.
