FISHING CHAIRMAN'S REPORT

Greetings everyone. I just got back from my annual fishing trip to Bridgeport Ca. for the Eastern Sierra Trout Opener. It's a trip I have been doing since the late seventies. Missed last year because everything was shut down due to the pandemic.

Every year is always an adventure and never the same. This was a wild one and surely one I'll remember for some time. This year there were 9 of us and 3 boats with my boat being the smallest in our group. The other 2 boats were a 21-foot and a 22-foot North Rivers. Bridgeport Reservoir lake levels were the lowest I've seen in years. The boat ramps were closed and we had to launch from the shore line into strong incoming winds with no dock and a rocky shoreline in the dark.

It was an adventurous day and just as adventurous for the larger boats because we were all beaten by the strong winds. The weather reports were calling for wind gust over 50 mph. I think they lied to us. They were just a little over 45 mph. Going with the wind the boat speed was almost 4 mph with the kicker motor at its lowest rpms. Going into the wind we were taking water over the bow and many times over the windshield.

Surprisingly it wasn't too cold with the change of rain or snow also mixed into the forecast. At times you could see a half-dozen dust busters along the shoreline turning into small waterspouts as they went across the water. There were threatening clouds in the mountains just a few miles away yet there were plenty of boats on

the lake. Fishing was still good with plenty of Browns from 2 to 5 lbs. There were a few lost fish that probably were over 6 lbs. A very large tagged rainbow bent the hooks and got away while trying to net it at the boat. A \$700.00 pot for the largest tagged rainbows is to be given away at the end of the season. That could have been a winner. In my boat we got all Browns and not one Rainbow with the largest at 5 lb. Only 1 Rainbow was netted all morning in our group.

Along on our trip this year was **Justin Wolff** of Angler West. He was there to do a video shoot for future video release on Bridgeport Reservoir trout opener. I will let you know when it will air on the Outdoor Channel or on YouTube.

The only other fishing news I have is in the delta. I was out again 2 more times in April and did ok with lots of 18 to 24 inchers with no big ones. Tight Lines Guide Service reported last week they are still getting limits. I have no other reports.

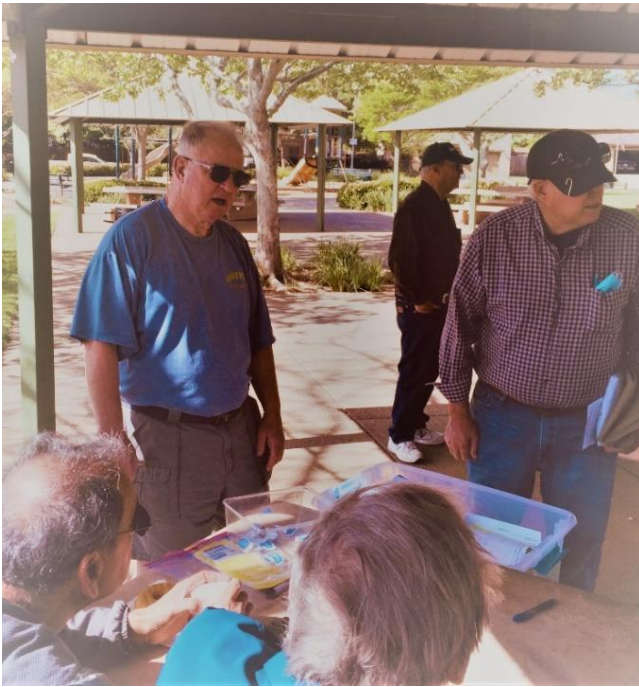
