
On another note:

I took my boat up to Oregon and fished for six days at the beginning of April. I fished with a guide my first day out on the Willamette and he did an excellent job teaching me about presentation and where fish hold in different tide conditions. He invited me to join him and his partner the next day on the Columbia out of Gleason launch by the airport. The number of 24'-26' foot sleds launching before sunrise was incredible. I have never seen that many boats on the water as the Columbia spring run was closing that day. I fished the Willamette River through five or six fishing zones from below Oregon City down to the Columbia River and the head of the Multnomah Channel.

I was fortunate to catch a spring Chinook salmon and had a couple of other chances. One good reason was Walter Vanhoy's son Roger was with me and did an outstanding job. Really enjoyed spending two days on the water with Roger. Roger lives relatively close by in Battle Ground Washington.

Learned a lot about areas to fish, trolling patterns, rigging cut plug and whole herring and three different boat launches. An amazing fishery and so scenic.
