

Striped Bass Fishing April 2023 with Brett Brady

I was awakened by a phone call, which I could not answer, because I could not figure out which button to press on the phone. Shortly thereafter, there was a loud pounding on our front door. I jumped pout of bed and put on a pair pf underwear, before stumbling to open the front door as I was cursing to myself, "son of bitch". I had overslept! I was supposed to have been up for at least half an hour or more. Bob Bonner and Steve Paulick were already there waiting for me. Steve said they had been trying to get me to answer them for some time! I thought to myself, "what a great way to start the day". At first, I thought that my alarm had not gone off. I later realized that it was on and ringing. I just could not hear it; my hearing has gotten that bad. Charlene was visiting her sister-in-law in Boise, so she was not there to wake me up.

Anyway, I proceeded to get my act together as quickly as possible, while asking if someone could call **Walter** (Van Hoy) to let him know that we were running late. We were supposed to meet **Brett Brady, Bare Bones Guide Service**, on the Feather River at Boyd's Pump in Yuba City around 5:45 AM. We were probably going to be late, and we were going to have to let him know as well.

After picking up Walter in West Sacramento, we were on our way. We actually made very good time, and we were not too late in getting there. After loading everything we needed into Brett's boat, off we went on a 20-minute, very cold, boat ride. Brett told us to be prepared and to dress appropriately. Even so, I waited too long to put on my gloves, which I could not get on. They were too tight. After a while, I had to go pee. That's when I found out that my hands would not function as they had gotten too cold. I could not button my pants back up. I don't think Charlene could have helped me out of this predicament. **Son-of-a bitch!** It is so nice to get old.

One of Brett's fishing holes was near the mouth of the Bear River. Well, wouldn't you know it, we were greeted there by a sea lion or two. One of which was chomping on a large striper. Great, I think we were all wondering: *"What the hell are sea lions doing way up here?"* I thought Brett did the best he could under the circumstances, and we did manage to catch a few shakers. We tied a few places in this stretch of the river with little or no success. Besides the sea lions, the other problem we were having was that the water was still a little too cold to draw up a lot of fish.

The next place we tried was about a mile up the Bear River. Guess what? The sea lion, or one of the sea lions had followed us up there. At one point, we witnessed the fresh, floating carcass of a dead fish whose head had been chewed off??? Even so, we did manage to catch our first keeper there, and I think we managed a double up there. After a while, the action slowed, and Brett decided that it was time to move again.

After a 20 minute plus boat ride, we ended up near the mouth of the Yuba River. Right away, we started to catch fish. Time and again, I marveled at how Brett was adroitly maneuvering his boat to drift down stream in order to put our boat in the best possible position for us to catch fish. You should keep in mind that this type of fishing, drifting live minnows, lends itself to getting snagged as you are bouncing off the bottom of the river. Inevitably, you get snagged on rocks or vegetation, and you get broken off. Some of your gear needs to be replaced. Again, I admired how Brett was able to handle this chore without a bit of hesitation or concern, while keeping the boat in the right place so the rest of us could continue to fish. It was part of his job, and he accepted it. I did not keep track of the number of fish we caught at this last spot, but it was definitely the best. It made our day. Bob Bonner caught the "big fish" of the day, which was a chunky 5 pounder. All of us were satisfied with our day of fishing with Brett, and we want to thank him for treating us to such enjoyable day. If you have not fished with Brett, Bare Bones Guide Service, I would highly recommend his service.

Before I close this out, on the drive home, Steve Paulick was giving Bob Bonner a couple of recipes on how to prepare different fish. They sounded pretty complicated...I wonder if he could put them into written form for the rest of us?
