### FISHING CHAIRMAN'S REPORT

Hello everyone.

If you haven't seen me already I did make it back from my 16 day trip to Arizona. We had a good time besides the 4 days of pulling the travel trailer over 1900 miles. We were able to hike 5 days, kayak on to 2 different lakes, and play 2 rounds of golf while we were there. I was able to visit my cousin who took us out to dinner to the "Palace Saloon" in Prescott AZ. The Palace Saloon has not changed much from the days when Wyatt and Virgil Earp, Doc Holliday and Big Nose Kate spent time there. I got back just in time to fish Stampede Reservoir with our group.

I was able to get to Stampede the night before and had no problem finding a campsite. The campground was almost empty and I found a nice quiet spot and spent a chilling night in the back of the truck. It was 28 degrees when I launched at 5:15 am. I didn't get my first Kokanee into the boat until 9:15 when the bite started. In a short time I had 2 double hookups and landed 9 Koks. They were all about the same size. I keep 4 of them, 2 of which were the largest taken that day by the group. One rod was at 40ft. with a pink Apex the other at 60ft. with an orange/yellow hoochie. After that I switched over to fish for Mackinac for a while. I can see them on the fish finder but no takers. Went back to kokanee fishing again and got into another bite around 11:30 on the back side of the island and they were all dinks.

The lake is the fullest I have seen it in a long time. The camp host said the lake came up 3 ft. in 3 days. The ramp to the dock was under water when I got there on Monday night.

Thanks to **Pat's Guide Service** he pulled the ramp up into position with his truck in the morning before most of the fisherman got there. Thanks to **Paul Wells** we had a great lunch of hot dogs and his homemade chili. The weather was just perfect no wind all morning and the sun felt just fine and it got me warmed up.

On the subject on Kokanee at the Kokanee Power Derby on June 3 at New Melones the 2 largest Kokanee weighed in at 2.87 and 2.73lbs.


## Icehouse Reservoir 7/2/2023
