Greetings everyone. Well August was not much of a fishing month. The club did not have any outings for the past 2 months now. I hope we can get something going in September. I did go out to Folsom Lake on the day we were to have the NDO and it was good we didn't have the outing there. The day was very hot and I was off the lake and heading home by 11:30. The lake is dropping at rate of 6 or more inches a day now. Trying to stay in the main channel and finding deep water was a challenge. I was targeting 80 to 90 feet for Kings but the top of the trees kept showing up on the fish finder. I already lost one weight this year and I wasn't going to lose another. I'm done with Folsom for now and that's the only place I went for the month. No Fish that day.

I don't know what happen to the boat in the picture. It was high and dry and a long way from the water line. Did they beach it overnight and lake dropped so much they couldn't get back in the water and had to leave it there? Maybe they ran it aground and damaged the fiberglass hull? It's a fairly new 20' boat located on the point between the South Fork and Granite Bay at Folsom Lake.



And I'm starting to see only a few Salmon in the Nimbus Dam Basin. I know they are there because some of the birds are starting to show up. I stop once or twice week and look for a few minutes for the splash on the surface. I figure if I see one fish there must be many more that I don't see. What's hot besides the weather.

Stripers are doing well in the Delta
Salmon fishing continues to be really good outside the SF Bay.

Sacramento River Salmon is Hot & cold
Lake Pardee kokanee and trout and Camanche trout.
Bullards Bar and Stampede kokanee still good but going to end soon.

I'm looking for a nice day on a mountain lake but not sure where to go. Thinking Union Valley and even Echo Lake for a 2 day trip.


