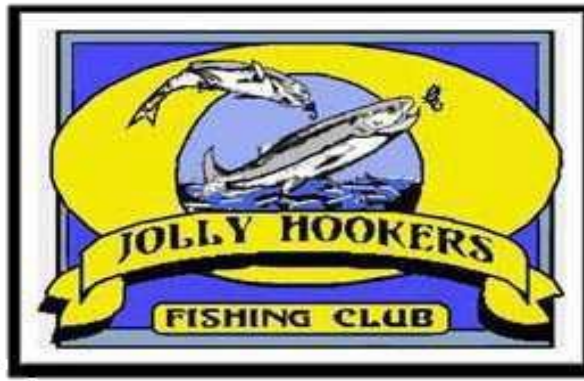

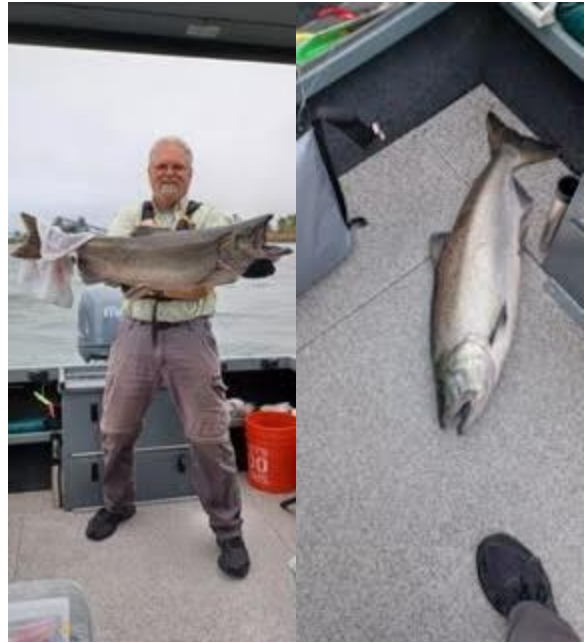
Report from Rick Schrichfield 9/10/2025

My friend Roger Van Hoy and I fished at the mouth of the Cowlitz River where it empties into the Columbia River today. Launching in the near dark at Rainier OR. We caught these two nice hatchery chinooks. Roger caught his on a pink Yakima spinfish and I caught mine on a Brad's double trouble superbait. We were both stuffing our plugs with tuna cured in Krill, Salmon Slammer and Addicted Salmon Blend. We were using 10'6" rods with a 11 Protroll/Short Bus dodger and a slider with a 12oz. weight on a one foot dropper. We fished near the bottom of the river in 30' of water. We saw 30+ salmon caught today. We were done by 10:30. We had two other hook ups and released them.

Second Report:

The area from Buoy 10 to St. Helens has closed so we fish moved up river to Scapoose OR and had limits by 7:30 this morning. There were 75-100 boats in a quarter mile area just above where the Lewis River comes into the Columbia. Folks were very cooperative

We again fished out of Scapoose Bay Marina again yesterday and had to work a bit harder for these two salmon. The first came at 11 AM on a spinner and the second came on a Brad's super bait twisted sister. We were at the marina at 5:15 and headed out in the dark to find 100 of our best friends already hunting salmon. Amazing that most folks are courteous and move when you're fighting a fish. Must be near time to come home, the freezer is about full. I plan on fishing solo for another day or two so may have another report.
